A reminder to everyone:

If you see something that doesn't look right, call the POLICE. If you see someone speeding up and down your street, call the POLICE. If you see someone breaking in to a house, call the POLICE. DANWA is not a policing organization, we are here to help thwart crime and attempt to be eyes and ears for the police but the **first action anyone should take is to call the POLICE—FIRST** if it is an ***emergency, call 911***, if it is information or to report a car speeding and you have his tag number, call **677-2443 CALL POLICE FIRST...**

Situations/scenarios:

Without getting paranoid, just think first and be on guard!

1. A person stops at your house and tries to draw you out to the street to look at something. They talk so fast about random things, but asked who is in the house? They comment that your home looks like a safe place for them to stop. They might claim to be out of gas. They might ask question about another house somewhere. They might ask directions to a house on another street. They state they're looking for the Adam's Family with a paddle boat in the front yard. Note how strange the questions might be.
 - A. They don't need to know who is in the house.
 - B. They don't need to know how many people are in the house.
 - C. It is good to know the home looks like a safe place.
 - D. They are out of gas, SORRY, they should have planned better. There is a gas station not too far away.

Don't be a Victim

Wise words from one of our policemen: Many of us have bad habits that have taken years to perfect. Some habits like leaving your vehicle unlocked or setting the cardboard box from your new 50" LCD at the curb in front of your home can only serve as an invite to criminals looking for a place to practice their activity. We live in a City that is getting better every year, recently three problem apartment complexes that have kept Police and Fire Personnel busy for decades, closed down and vacated everyone living on the properties. The fact the complexes are empty will benefit us all but crime will still occur as long as there are victims willing to make stealing easy for the suspects. Cardboard boxes should be cut up and placed in the trash receptacles and vehicles should be secured to protect your property.

Dogs barking

Sometimes it gets frustrating to hear some of them "constantly" bark and it is not always an indication that something is happening around the area but - - - then again, don't let it be something that you don't check out. Could be an unwanted "visitor" next door or even behind your home or across the street near your location. If you see an unfamiliar vehicle, note the make, color, possibly the tag number, who knows it might come in handy!

Occasionally we make comments in this periodical relating to joining the neighborhood watch, being a part of the neighborhood watch, and **WE NEED YOU!** You might say “I don’t have time” or “I would like to do something but I have to go somewhere right now”. Don’t think of it as helping DANWA, think of it as **HELPING YOUR NEIGHBOR.**

As little as you think about it, you can help more than you realize. Not only by becoming a patroller but when you go out to pick up your daily paper in the morning or you leave your driveway in the morning, afternoon, or night. Do you look around to see if your neighbor’s car is there or how about the two or three cars up or down your street that you see every day, are they still there or is there a **DIFFERENT** car or truck in their driveway? Does something look suspicious?

How about just looking out your window or door, do you see something strange or maybe an unfamiliar car driving up or down the street, how about some individual walking in the street, have you seen them before, do they look suspicious? Look around, do you see suspicious activity? **CALL THE COPS!** Don’t wait, let the police determine if they are up to no good. Ask yourself what else can I do to help my neighbors.....?

If you can only afford one hour a month, it will help. You don’t have to participate 100% of your time. Just think of all the members we have; if one member took one hour out of their schedule for DANWA and there were one hundred members who took that hour, that is one hundred hours more this neighborhood could have **GOOD** eyes watching. If you feel it is an emergency, you can report directly to the police by using 911 on the phone.
