

- City ordinances and things you need to know -

Mowed grass (aka grass clippings) blown into the streets is a violation of city ordinance and can result in a fine plus court cost. Please understand that leaving grass clippings in the street is against EPA and City codes. Here's what happens: over time they clog the drainage structures that transport runoff. The lines were sized to handle a certain amount of water. Over time two things have happened to reduce their capacity. First the lines have gotten older. The joints are no longer in tact, bellies that hold water have developed, the concrete pipe has developed cracks or breaks and the galvanized pipe has rusted. This causes things to hang up inside the pipe and restricts the flow. Additionally, the amount of hard surface in the city has increased since the pipes have been installed. The additional hard surface allows water to arrive at the pipe quicker, so more water tries to get in it. When it can't get in the pipe, it will find someplace else to go causing local flooding. Not allowing grass clippings to go down the storm drain helps reduce blockage problems which talks to the quality of water. And finally, grass clippings also carry fertilizer and pesticides that reduce the "quality" of the water at the receiving end. Sooner or later someone will process Del City's rain water for drinking or go swimming in it.

This leads us to talk about **swimming pool water**— - - Also, DON'T drain your swimming pool in the street, use the household sewer drain or cleanout which allows that water to be processed and reused. Swimming pools have chlorine for disinfection. Chlorine has an adverse impact on aquatic life. When pool water is allowed to run down to the stream, the chlorine kills off some of the low end of the food chain at the receiving stream. When pool water is placed in the sanitary sewer system, there are limited problems. Some very large sewer systems even chlorinate the collection lines to prevent odor problems. If you drain it in the street the water eventually winds up in the storm drain creeks. The chemicals in the swimming pool water will counteract unfavorably with the creek drains and does bad things to the vegetation, animals, mammals, killing things on down stream that actually provide good things for the drain areas, rivers and natural habitat.
