From the DANWA President:

Hello everyone,

We are now into the month of February and that means that it is time for membership renewal. All memberships expire on the last day of February, no matter when paid. As usual the yearly membership dues are \$12.00 for the entire year. The membership dues collected are used to buy or replace equipment for the Patrollers and the Watch Group and fund our projects throughout the year. Some of those projects include bouncy balls for the Armed Forces Parade, Orval Ray Cookout, Glow bracelets for Halloween patrol, Del City Night out cookout, Donation to the Mid-Del Food Pantry, donation to the Tinker Food Pantry and Donation for the Townsend Elementary end of School Party to list a few. No funds are used for the Patrollers except to furnish their equipment. All Patrollers volunteer their time, use of their vehicle and gas to help keep our neighborhood a safer place to live. Simply fill out the enclosed Membership application, put it in the provided envelope and mail in. Know that all in your information is never given to anyone except the Patrollers or the Police in the case of an emergency, if needed.

There were 6 Residential Burglaries in our area in the month of December, and as in the last few months, most took place in the areas just off Sunnyslane or SE 44th Street. EARTHQUAKE SAFETY TIPS

The recent earthquakes rumbling the state have been unnerving for many residents. Earthquakes can come at any time without warning so it's important to know what to do when one hits.

OUTDOORS: Stay there—Move away from buildings, streetlights and utility wires. The greatest danger exists at exits and alongside exterior walls.

INDOORS: Drop to the ground, take cover by getting under a sturdy table or other piece of furniture and hold on until the shaking stops. Stay away from windows, doors and walls and anything that could fall. If you are in bed, stay there. Stay inside until the shaking stops. Most injuries occur when people move to a different room or try to leave the building.

VEHICLE: Stop and stay in the vehicle. Avoid stopping near or under buildings, trees, overpasses and utility wires. Avoid driving on roads, bridges or ramps that might have been damaged by the earthquake.



Trap the Grease

In the City of Del City, cooking grease is one of the major causes of residential pipeline and city sewer blockages. The spilled sewage eventually reaches Oklahoma streams and rivers, causing unsafe conditions.

By following a few simple steps, you can help prevent costly sewage overflows in the future.

Step 1

All fats, oils, and grease should be poured into a coffee can, or other durable container, and disposed of in the trash and not down the drain.

Step 2

Dishes and pots that are coated with greasy leftovers should be wiped clean with a paper towel before washing or placing in dishwasher. Toss the paper towel in the trash can.

Step 3

Scrape all scraps into the trash. Don't put any scraps in the garbage disposal. Dispose of them in the trash can or compost.

Important Facts

- Cooking grease coats pipelines in a way similar to the way all fatty foods clog human arteries. The grease clings to the inside of the pipe, eventually causing complete blockage.
- Grease should NEVER be poured down the drain. Running hot water and pouring detergent down the drain only breaks up grease temporarily. As the grease moves through the pipe, it separates from the water and begins to coat the pipe.
- Flushing grease down the toilet also causes sewer blockages

Report Sewage Overflows

If you see, hear or smell something you think might be a sewer overflow, report it immediately by calling 671-2878 during normal working hours and 671-3011 on weekends and after hours.
