From the DANWA President:

Hello everyone,

The neighborhood had another good month in November with Residential Burglaries, Auto Burglaries and Larcenies all down a lot from October. There were no arrests for Residential Burglaries in the month of October. The good news is that Del City wide; the Residential Burglaries are down 72% from November of last year. For the DANWA area, our numbers were the same as last year at 2.

Information to pass along: The city has a full complement of 35 Officers at this time. The purchase process has been started to replace the current fleet of police cars. Thanks to the continuation of the sales tax, 36 new police cars will be purchased. These new cars will all be black and white in color. The estimated cost will be about 1.2 million dollars. All vehicles will be All Wheel Drive (AWD) and they will be Ford Taurus' and SUV's. The City is also working on a newly designed City website that will be of better design and more user friendly.

The DANWA Officer elections were held at the December Membership meeting. As there were no nominations for any of the Officer positions, a motion was made to re-elect the current officers to the positions currently held. The motion passed. We still however, do not have a Patrol Capitan. If anyone would like to fill that position it is open.

One last item; I hope to have the Free Dump schedule for all of 2013 in February's newsletter and on the web site. Be Safe!

Scout Corner
Farewell DANWA,



After 22 years, Boy Scout Troop 60 has finally rolled up its last tent and put out its last campfire. Cub Scout Pack 60 was established back in the early 1950's and met at Townsend Elementary School. In 1987, a couple of Cub leaders decided to form Boy Scout Troop 60 so the older boys could advance and stay in the neighborhood.

Matt Kirk earned his Eagle Rank earlier this year. The Eagle Rank is the highest rank in scouting, and only 2% of all scouts ever reach this goal. Over the years, Troop 60 has had 7 young men who have achieved this rank. Many young men from Troop 60 have gone on to achieve great things in their early adult years, including a number of engineers, some computer programmers, a professional photographer, a pharmacist, an air traffic controller, some auto mechanics and a variety of other career fields. Throughout its 22 year history, Troop 60 has tried to be a positive influence on the lives of young men from the Del City area.

Troop 60 has participated in a number of service projects to benefit the community, including DANWA Trash Clean-Up Projects, tree removal, various food drives, flag retirements, painting projects for the city, and churches in the area, building bridges on a nature trail etc. One of our notable service projects was participating in the 45 Infantry Division Memorial Day Ceremony for 18 years straight. Troop 60 has been proud to serve the community in any way possible.

The boys of Troop 60 have participated in numerous activities including rock climbing, rappelling, hiking, camping, swimming, fishing, canoeing, sailing, biking etc. The boys have had an opportunity to simply have fun in the out of doors with a group of their friends. The scouts have earned a variety of the 120 merit badges that train young men in various activities and skills that may someday lead them to develop an interest in a future career field or hobby.

The adult leaders of Troop 60 have been proud to guide the youth of the area in the scouting program. At this point, we have had some boys who have turned 18, and must move on, and some others who have transferred to a Troop closer to their home. We simply do not have enough boys left to officially register as a Troop in January. It has simply become more and more difficult to pry young men away from their computers, or their sports team practices to be involved with Boy Scouting. It is sadly necessary to close down Boy Scout Troop 60.

Troop 60 would not have been able to survive all of these years without the dedicated leaders and the generous support of DANWA, which has made it possible for us to take trips down the Illinois River, and to Slippery Falls Boy Scout Camp. Your generosity has been greatly appreciated. You have helped many young men in their transition to adulthood.

If there is someone who would like to pick up the gauntlet and run with it, I know there will be plenty of former leaders that would be glad to help.

As for aluminum cans, I will still be asking all to collect your aluminum cans and I will still collect them. For one, it helps the ecology by recycling and parts of proceeds collected will be donated to needy organizations and local Cub and Boy Scout groups. We already donated money to the Salvation Army and the American Red Cross to help with the hurricane "Sandy" relief. So if you have cans you can drop them off at my home or call me at 672-0633 and I will pick them up.

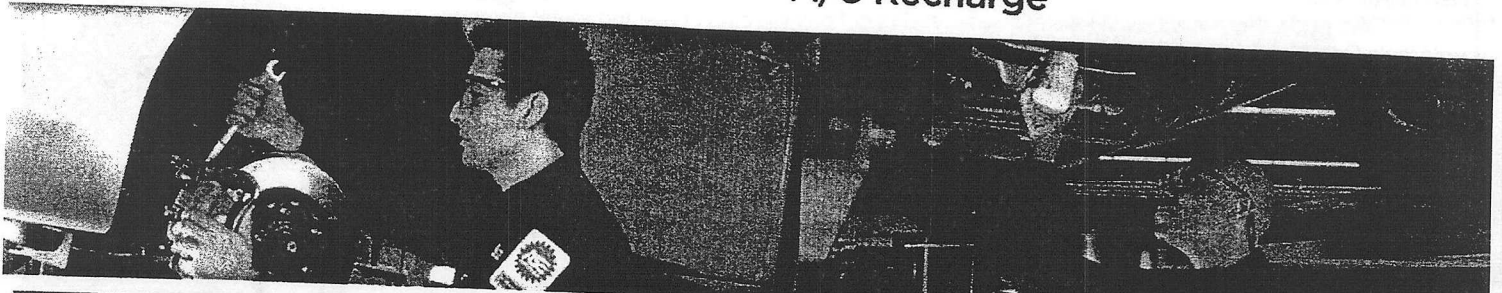
