Originally the City of Del City asked the neighborhood watches to provide information from the various neighborhood watch groups. The intent was to provide information to new residents that a neighborhood watch was active in their area and if they were interested the information and application form were made available to the new resident.

Last month (January) you probably received a pamphlet with your water bill that had Epperly Heights information on it. This was an error from the city's printer and only those in Epperly Heights area were supposed to receive the flier/application. If you accidentally completed the application and sent it to Epperly Heights, they are supposed to return it to us (DANWA).

You will notice in this newsletter the yearly application and envelope are enclosed. If your desire is to become or remain a member, please fill it out COMPLETELY and as quickly as possible. Regardless of how long you have been a member, this verifies current information and the information you provide on the application is "confidential" and only released to the patrollers and base stations who patrol the streets. The information is vital should it be necessary to contact you or your designated LOCAL contact in case of an emergency involving your home or even you. **For instance if you give your emergency contact number of a relative living in Maine or California, it's not going to do much good calling them long distance and telling them that 'your' garage is flooding with water because of a water line break in your home.** Again, the information on the application is "secure" and not released to anyone except those who might have need to contact YOU or your designated emergency contact.

Membership is \$12.00 a year, per address, and covers from March 1st this year to February 28th the following year. Obviously donations are appreciated. **NOTE: Nobody is paid in the Association, all is voluntary, i.e. the patrollers do not get subsidized for the use of their autos, gas, or time.** Here are a few of the things your membership dues and donations are used for:

If you are interested in becoming an active participant, block captain, and/or a patroller within the membership, we welcome you with open arms and will help you with any questions you might have regarding what goes on or how you can further help and even becoming an officer. We'll teach you how to contact the proper authorities if you see suspicious activity. By becoming a patroller, you can help keep the crime rate down by learning how to contact the police if there is something suspicious going on or something that seems to be out of the ordinary, i.e. someone breaking into a home or auto. We continually need your help as open eyes for suspicious activity whether a non-member, member or patroller. We are not the police, just eyes and ears to help them when we can.

Just for good info; emergency call 911, non-emergency, call 677-2443.

Notice on page two of this newsletter the need for "block captains" - to deliver the newsletter to the doors of home owners. We can also use your help with that. If you are in that area or want to take on that area, contact either of the "District Captains".
