#### Winter terms to know:

**Freezing Rain**—Rain that freezes on contact with roads, trees, sidewalks, etc.

**Sleet**—Rain that freezes before hitting the ground.

**Winter storm watch**— a winter storm is possible in the area.

**Blizzard warning**— winds or gusts 35 mph or greater, along with snow are expected to last 3 hours or more.

**Winter storm warning**—a winter storm is occurring or will begin soon.

**Frost/freeze warning**— temperatures are expected to drop below freezing.

#### If your vehicle is stranded in a blizzard:

- Pull off the road and turn on your hazard lights.
- Do not start walking unless you can see a building where you can take shelter..
- If no buildings are in sight, stay in your vehicle where rescu-

ers are more likely to find you.

- Wrap yourself in blankets or use seat covers, floor mats and maps.
- Run the engine for 10 minutes each hour to keep warm. Open a window slightly for ventilation
- Balance use of the heater and lights to conserve the battery
- If stuck in a remote location spell out 'HELP" or "SOS" with rocks or branches.

#### Winterize your vehicle:

- Check the wipers, battery, heater, defroster, ignition system, lights, oil, and tire pressure.
- Consider purchasing snow tires or chains.
- Pack a winter emergency kit with a window scraper, blankets, battery-operated radio, flashlight, water, snack food, tow chain or rope, shovel and flares.

He also provided that City Hall will be reworked within so the Customer Service Manager will be near the front door making it easier to provide service to Del City citizens.

And finally the Grand Opening of the new Del City Library is scheduled to take place on March 6, 2021.

A primary election is scheduled for February 9, 2021 and a general election for April 6, 2021 for COUNCILPERSON for ward 2 and for ward 4, both are full 4 year terms and voting will be by ward, i.e. if you are in ward 2 you will only vote for ward 2 council person, if you are in ward 4 you will only vote for ward 4.

This information is regarding Del City Bulk Waste Program

### **Bulk Waste Set Out Procedures**

- Items should be set out **at least five (5) feet from mailboxes, gas meters, cars, shrubs, trees, signs.**
- **Look up before starting your pile for high line wires and Overhanging tree limbs. Do not place items on the City water meters.**
- Items should be set out at least ten (10) feet away from utility poles, to prevent contact with overhead power lines.
- Place your Bulk Waste **at the curb** no earlier than **Thursday** of the week before, but no later than 6 am on **Monday**, the week of.
- **Small or loose items (such as cloths and toys) must be boxed up or placed in trash bags to be picked up!!!**
- **Contractors** will pick up no more than **four (4) cubic yards, a pile size of 3 foot X 6 foot X 6 foot.** (That's about the size of 4 washing machines side by side). If the pile is larger, it will be up to the resident to remove the remaining amount or make arrangements with the Sanitation Division to have the material picked up at an additional charge. The bulk waste service is for Residential Customers only. Commercial businesses are not included in the bulk waste program. Contractors will make **one (1) pass** through the City on each event.

**They will pick up:** Cardboard boxes—broken down and tied into tight bundles, Non-contracted remodeling waste (do-it-yourself projects), Carpets, Mattresses, Fencing Household appliances Furniture, trees and limbs.

**The will NOT pick up:** Contractor Tree and Grass Trimmings, Contractor Construction/ Reconstruction/Demolition, Antifreeze, Automobile Frames, Brake Fluid, Tires and Rims, Car Battery, Gasoline, Kerosene and Other Fuels, Acids and Caustics, Crankcases or Transmissions, Degreasers, Explosives, Fertilizer, Hospital/Medical Waste, Lubricants, Nuclear Materials, Oils, Pesticides, Poisons, Bricks, Dirt, Rocks, Concrete, Propane Tanks, Repair Waste, Rust Remover, Sewage and Liquid Waste, Sheetrock or Roofing Items, Pool Chemicals.

Don't forget to feed the birds, keep fresh water for your pet to drink, and if your pet stays outside, be sure the water hasn't turned into ice. Spring is just around the corner, the corner might seem far away but it isn't, it's almost here. Check out the Cardinals and Robins as they look for food.
