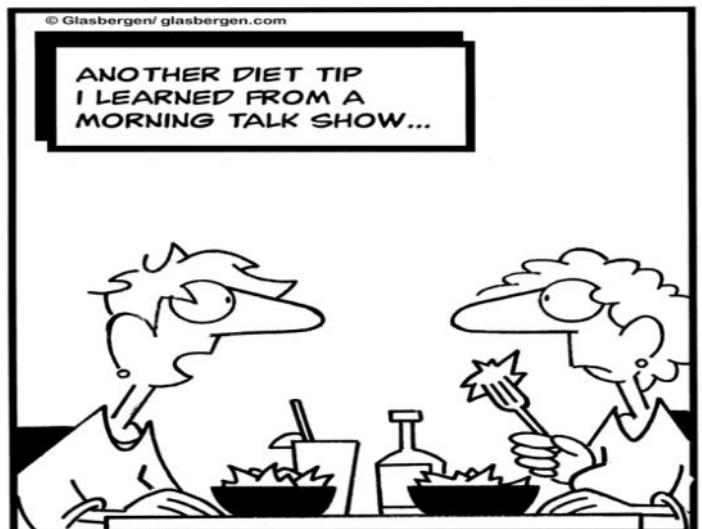

The action to abate an unsightly nuisance from private property takes much time by city officials, and the work is steadily ongoing. Two things neighbors can do to address this issue. First, Code Enforcement Officers cannot drive around looking for code violations. They can and do however react to complaints filed by citizens. So when you are confronted with a bad situation you should contact code enforcement at 405-677-5741. Second, sometimes the property owner or resident at a blighted site is suffering from physical or financial difficulties. It is possible that DANWA may be able to help by offering neighborly assistance to help clean up a situation.

If you notice stray dogs or cats or wild animals such as possum, foxes, or skunks that interfere with your life style at home or property you should contact Del City Animal Control at once. Perhaps a neighbors pet is being a nuisance, and you cannot seem to resolve the issue, then you should contact Del City Animal Control. When needed, you can contact animal control via police dispatch by dialing 405-677-2443.

As we patrol the neighborhood we see wrecked vehicles that should be garaged, OUT OF SIGHT but are left outside. What a lovely sight when you come into your neighborhood!!! Many times you parked on the curb and have not moved it for weeks, for whatever reason. This is a problem that should never happen. Yes you can dog me all you want on these situations but too many times it has been let go and many parts of the city are starting to look TRASHY. Stop and think about it, is your untagged car still sitting in the driveway backwards so the police can't see there is an outdated tag or no tag at all the vehicle. That is illegal, there must be a tag of some sort and it must be within date.

On we go to TRASH.... The city has made every effort to help the citizens clean up their property and you can put your bulk trash out THE WEEK OF PICKUP which is established by wards. If you are in Ward 1, the first week of the month is Bulk Trash Pickup for your ward. DON'T WAIT till Monday night to put it out. You will be in the situation of someone calling in and reporting you have trash on the curb and you are obligated to pay the city to come pick it up. For Ward 3 it is the third week of the month and same goes for you, DON'T WAIT till Monday night to put it out!!!! Unfortunately this, to me, has created more problems in that there is trash sitting out ALL MONTH LONG. Now if for some reason it wasn't picked up, there might be more of an issue of what you have laying out there, i.e. tires, batteries, are a NO NO!!! That's not the only NO NO so you should contact the City and find out what is going on.

So you missed the bulk trash pickup day, call City Hall 405-671-2873 and pay to have them come pick it up, it's so unsightly and trashy because you didn't think ahead and get it out correctly for the bulk trash pickup day!!!
